\* The two- and three-note slurs should continue throughout statements of this eight-measure polyphonic theme which combines the B $\flat$  - B $\natural$  - E rhythmic motive with syncopated taps on E. This opening theme is best played with two hands and requires pedal. Careful pedaling in the octave statements in mm. 9-16 and 54-61 will sustain the longer pitches in the lower voice. Thus the B $\flat$ 's in bar 9 should sound as dotted half notes, though they have as a matter of practicality been printed as quarter notes.

\* The glissandi are to be played with the fingernail of the right thumb, with intensification into the destination pitches.

\*\* The higher register of this last return of the *idée fixe* marks an escape from what could otherwise be an unending loop, frozen in time, with m. 73 leading back to m. 1 and to unlimited repetitions of the emblematic theme interspersed by its two contrasting episodes. The duration of the piece without any such repetitions is about 3 minutes.
